CAMP JOB DESCRIPTIONS

Job descriptions and responsibilities for each are provided for our most common positions although not listed in full; however, the main responsibilities are listed for a better understanding of the types of tasks involved for each position. In addition, you will be responsible to do all tasks your supervisor asks you to do.

SENIOR COUNSELOR

- 17 years of age or older
- Ability to get along with different types of people
- Able to demonstrate a personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- Able to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with a child
- Able to lead a devotional for the campers in your cabin
- Comfortable talking to a child about a personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- Be responsible for up to 12 children ages 8-12
- Help facilitate sports, nature, craft activities
- Responsible for documenting and handling behavioral problems
- Greet parents on Monday and Friday

JUNIOR COUNSELOR

- 16 years of age or older
- Able to get along with different types of people
- Able to demonstrate a personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- Comfortable talking to a child about a personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- Responsible to take the campers to their morning classes
- Responsible for up to 12 children ages 8-12
- Responsible for documenting and handling behavioral problems

JOB DESCRIPTIONS

continued

Maintenance worker

- 15 years of age or older
- Able to get along with different types of people
- Able to demonstrate a personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- Accountable to your supervisor and willing to do what is asked of you
- Responsible for grass cutting in the barn, pool, and cabin area
- Responsible for cleaning the bathhouse and portable toilets
- Responsible for helping clean up after meals and cleaning the Shafer Building bathrooms
- Responsible for taking water to water stations and collecting trash
- Responsible to return equipment in the same condition that it was given to you

KITCHEN WORKER

- 15 years of age or older
- Able to get along with different types of people
- Able to demonstrate a personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- Responsible for helping set up before meals and clean up after meals
- Accountable to your supervisor and willing to do what is asked of you
- Responsible for helping prepare afternoon and evening snacks

Barn Hand

- 15 years of age or older
- Able to get along with different types of people
- Able to demonstrate a personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- Accountable to your supervisor and willing to do what is asked of you
- Must know how to saddle a horse
- Must demonstrate ability to lead a horse with child on it
- Responsible for helping feed and care for animals throughout the day
- Able to work well in hot weather
- Responsible for documenting and handling behavioral problems

Dress code

Please note that the dress code applies to all camp events, including trainings, pre-camp, camp and retreats. We appreciate your cooperation in presenting a professional appearance to those we minister to.

GUY'S DRESS CODE

- You will be given 5 camp T-shirts to be worn at all times; except at the pool, Thursday chapel services, and in the evenings once girls and guys have gone to their separate areas for the night. If you lose a shirt you will need to purchase a replacement for \$5.
- Exception: Sunday night you do not have wear a camp shirt. Wear any appropriate T-shirt, but please no tank tops.
- Shorts/pants must have belt (no boxers should show) and be at least knee length.
- Pants/jeans must be loose fitting. No tight jeans, please.
- Maintenance workers are required to wear long pants when performing lawn care tasks.
- Please plan on dressing up for Thursday evening chapel services. For example, nice looking pants or shorts and a shirt with a collar. Please avoid t-shirts and jeans.
- Hair should be neatly cut; and should be above the ears and not touching the collar of the shirt. No extreme hairstyles or unnatural hair colors.
- Flip-flops are permitted, except during sports, physical activities, or at the barn.
- No necklaces, chains, or earrings are permitted. Facial piercing(s) and/or tongue piercings are not permitted. You will be asked to remove them. Clear jewelry is not allowed as a replacement.
- Tattoos must be covered during work hours and at all camp events, such as pre-camp training and worker retreat.

GIL'S DLESS CODE

- You will be given 5 camp T-shirts to be worn at all times; except at the pool, Thursday chapel services, and in the evenings once girls and guys have gone to their separate areas for the night. If you lose a shirt you will need to purchase a replacement for \$5.
- Exception: Sunday night you do not have to wear a camp shirt. Wear any appropriate T-shirt, but please no tank tops.
- Bermuda shorts and capris must be at least knee length.
- Tank tops and short shorts are only acceptable at night when guys are not present.
- Please plan on dressing up for Thursday evening chapel services. For example, you could wear a dress or skirt (knee length) or pants with a nice top. Please avoid t-shirts and jeans.
- All clothing should fit loosely.
- Tankinis or one-piece swimsuits should be worn at the pool. The midriff should be covered at all times. Bikinis and monokinis are not allowed. A t-shirt over a bikini is not acceptable.
- No extreme hairstyles or unnatural hair colors.
- Flip-flops are permitted, except during sports, physical activities, or at the barn.
- Facial piercings such as nose rings, eyebrow rings, and tongue piercings are not permitted. You will be asked to remove them. Clear jewelry is not allowed as a replacement.
- Bringing jewelry to camp is discouraged. It is permitted, but Camp Hope Haven is not responsible for any loss or damage to jewelry. Jewelry is prohibited in the pool area. Lifeguards are not responsible for jewelry that is left in pool area.
- Tattoos must be covered during work hours and at all camp events, such as pre-camp training and worker retreat.
