



When you hear the word "camp," what comes to mind? Fun, friends, swimming, bonfires? For Nick—former camper, staff member, and now leader at Camp Hope Haven—one word rises above the rest: life-changing.

Nick first heard about Camp Hope Haven as a curious sixyear-old. His older siblings came home raving about slip-nslides, swimming, games, and all the unforgettable fun. "I was jealous," he laughs. "Every summer, I'd beg my mom to let me go." At age eight, he finally got his chance—and he never looked back.

"Those early years were just pure fun," Nick remembers. "It was everything I imagined—nonstop excitement. I didn't really understand the spiritual side at first, but that started to change as I got older." One of the turning points came through a counselor named Luke. "I asked him a million questions. He never brushed me off. During free time, we'd end up talking about life and faith. Looking back, I can see God was drawing me to Him even then."

Nick's journey took a deeper turn in high school, when he joined the camp staff. "It was the best. I was more aware of my spiritual condition, and the camp leaders were super intentional. Still, while I claimed to be a Christian, my life didn't reflect that."

Then came the summer of 2020. "One night, I was overwhelmed by conviction. I just broke down before God. I told Him, 'If you'll take me, even with all my sin, I'm yours.

I'll give it all up to follow You.' After that night, camp felt even more joyful—because it all had purpose."

In 2021, Nick returned, this time with a mission: to serve Jesus, create a fun and safe place for kids, and help them see the love of Christ. "I wanted campers to feel what I felt—that this place could change your life."

And it's not just the staff who make that possible.
"Donors, sponsors, people who

pray—you're a huge part of these kids' stories too," Nick says.
"You're helping build a place where hearts are changed."

Nick's role has grown—from Camp Intern to Environmental Services Lead, to Boys Camp Lead. "It's the best job I've ever had," he says.

"Sharing the Gospel, helping kids understand the Bible, and having a blast doing it? It doesn't get much better than that!"





When Ruth talks about camp, it's with the conviction of someone whose life was changed by it—and now changes others' lives in return.

One moment that still moves her came during a heart-to-heart with a teenage girl struggling with sin and pain. "She told me I had shown her more love in a week than anyone else had in her whole life," Ruth recalls. "She cried as we talked about surrendering what our hearts want in exchange for Christ. It's not easy, but it's real—and it's where the Gospel meets them."

As Assistant Director, Ruth's days in summer revolve around staff and campers: "I oversee the staff, making sure they're trained and prepared to lead and love well. During the year, I'm mentoring interns to do the same—and handling all the behind-the-scenes logistics that keep things running."

Ruth's own story with Camp Hope Haven began when she was ten. "We

thought it would be too expensive, but a flyer showed how affordable it was. The first week I came, it felt like home. I saw the joy of the staff—it was contagious. When I turned 15, I joined the summer staff and discovered what real Christian community looked like. It wasn't perfect, but it was real—teens trying to follow Jesus in their mess. I rededicated my life to Christ that summer. I've been growing ever since."

Over the years, Ruth rose through the ranks—from camper to counselor to Assistant Director.

Camp Hope Haven now runs with around 60 summer staffers, ages 15 and up. "Teens 15–17 mostly serve as support staff—lifeguards, kitchen, cleaning, nature trails. Older staff step into counseling and teaching roles. We place two counselors per cabin, and each has strong leadership above them. We also have staff leading Bible studies, nature activities, and sports—always with a biblical focus."

So what does a day at camp look like? "After breakfast, cabins gather for Bible devotions. The rest of the day is packed with fun—everything from swimming to team games—all rooted in Scripture. We close out with chapel in the evening. We don't want to overwhelm them, but we make sure the message of Christ stays at the heart."

How can supporters get involved? "Please pray. Lives are changed here. I've seen campers and staff leave transformed—seen kids walk in hurting and walk out as leaders. It's like a small-scale revival." Or give funds to provide sponsorships to children who can not afford to go to camp.

Camp Hope Haven isn't just about summer fun. It's about transformation. "We watch kids discover who they are in Christ. They leave feeling seen, loved, and called to more. All the qualities of great leaders—they learn them here. All the glory goes to Jesus."



Michael Johnson had a unique obsession: car keys and key fobs. After he passed away, Michael's parents planned to keep the treasures that brought him so much joy. Then three years – to the day! – after his death, his mom saw a Facebook post from a neighbor looking to fulfill her son's birthday wish for car keys and key fobs. Their next step was clear, the Johnsons passed on Michael's legacy to a child who would cherish it just as much.

When it comes to your legacy and creating a will, you might think you don't have anything to give to your loved ones. The reality is you hold the keys to unlock meaningful gifts, and your will is one of the best ways to share them. Those gifts include:



- The gift of clarity. Having a will in place means your family won't have to guess at (or worse, disagree about) your wishes after you're gone. Instead, they'll have clear direction about your desires, from how you'd like your assets distributed to naming a guardian for your minor children.
- The gift of simplicity. In addition to clear instructions, a will maintains that information in one central location. Your up-to-date will means loved ones will easily find what they need and know their next steps.
- The gift of love. Psalm 145:4 reads, "Let each generation tell its children of your mighty acts; let them proclaim your power" (NLT). Your will is an opportunity to communicate about how your faith in God has changed you and the values that have shaped your life.
