FROM BROKENNESS TO Brotherhood

Through Faith and Service

At the Union Mission, stories of transformation are written every day—but few are as powerful as that of Donald. Once a guest seeking refuge, Donald became a servant-leader whose life now reflects the redemptive power of God's grace.

Years ago, Donald arrived at the Mission burdened by grief. "In a three-year period, I had very close relatives who passed away—mother and father, grandparents, a sister, and a brother. It was just too much," he shared. Emotionally overwhelmed, he withdrew from life until a friend encouraged him to seek help at the Mission.

That step of faith led him into the discipleship program and eventually into a 14-year career of service. "I say 'serve' because that's what we do—serve gentlemen," Donald said. Rising to the role of shelter manager supervisor, he helped bring structure and dignity to the Mission's operations. "The shelter staff are carefully trained professionals now in what they do."

But Donald's journey was far from easy. Five years ago, he suffered three strokes in one week. "I woke up on the floor in the morning. I didn't know what happened,"

he recalled. The strokes affected his cognition and patience—qualities essential for his role. "I realized I could no longer do the job effectively."

Then came another blow: a diagnosis of stage 4 prostate cancer. "By the time I had the diagnosis, the cancer had already spread into my lymph nodes," Donald said. Yet even in the face of illness, he continued to serve. Today, he teaches life-preparation classes to men at the Mission. "Who better to do it than someone who's been in their shoes?"

Through it all, Donald's faith has remained his anchor. "People say things like, 'There's a reason for this,' and you think, 'What reason would there be for me to have a stroke?' But it turned me around. It woke me up."

He speaks candidly about the emotional toll of illness. "I lost my self-confidence. I just raged at night... lying in bed, that's when you can let it go." But he also shares how God met him in those dark places. "I don't feel like it's a curse or a setback. There is a reason for it."

Donald's story is a reminder that healing often comes through community. "Most every man who comes in here has been broken in some fashion—and I'm living proof of it." His message to donors is clear: "You're creating productive men, citizens. These guys are coming out of here with newfound hope."

Triana's Story

OF STRENGTH AND RENEWAL

From Georgia to Virginia, Triana's path has been anything but easy—but it's been guided every step of the way by faith.

Triana spent nearly a decade as an assistant teacher at Clifton School in Atlanta, nurturing children with love and patience—a gift she inherited from her grandmother, a foster parent who raised her in a home full of children, church, and soul food. "It was normal for us to go out with 50 family members," she laughed. "That's just how we lived—together."

But life changed when Triana's health declined, and she began dialysis. The physical toll, combined with unstable housing and relationships, led her to make a bold move. At the invitation of a friend, she relocated to Virginia in search of healing and peace. What she found was unexpected—homelessness, uncertainty, and fear.

Yet Triana never lost her faith.

She found temporary shelter in a church and, through a divine connection, was guided to The Union Mission. "I didn't know what to expect," she said. "But I prayed, and God said, 'Just hold out.'" That first shower at the Mission was more than physical relief—it was a moment of safety and grace. She was welcomed with kindness, given food, and a bed. Now in the RISE Transition Program, Triana has time to breathe and heal as she takes financial classes, counseling, and studies God's Word.

Despite the exhaustion of dialysis and the challenges of starting over, Triana pressed forward. She found part-time work at Wegmans, stocking meats with joy and gratitude. "I never thought I'd be here," she smiled, "but I like it. It's a blessing."

She dreams of owning her own home, of welcoming her daughter and future son-in-law to Virginia, of having a kidney transplant, and of possibly returning to work with children or pursuing mental health counseling. "Everyone needs someone to talk to," she said. "Mental health is important—no matter who you are."

Through it all, Triana holds fast to her belief: "God is working. I just have to wait on Him." Her story is a testament

to the power of faith in the face of uncertainty. The Union Mission became her reset button—a place where hope is restored, and new beginnings are born.

Triana's journey reminds us that even in our darkest valleys, God walks with us. Her life is a living testimony that with faith, patience, and a heart open to grace, we can rise, rebuild, and rejoice.

3 Lessons for Building Your Legacy Game Plan

When it comes to football, you may rather root for the Commanders, Ravens or Panthers. (Note--we have fans from all three on staff here at the mission.) Still, those cheeseheads from up north are an intriguing bunch. They have a rich history, 13 world championships, and an ownership structure different from any other team in the league.

The Green Bay Packers are a publicly owned nonprofit corporation, the property of more than 500,000 shareholders who love the team and the Green Bay community. The shares can't be traded; they can only be passed between immediate family members, as a gift or through inheritance. The result? A football franchise that thrives in a small market and a legacy of loving tradition that's handed off between generations.

As you draw up your own legacy game plan, there are some helpful takeaways from the Packers and their fans.



YOUR LEGACY IS AS UNIQUE AS YOU ARE.

Like those who pass off their Packers shares, you also have a distinctive legacy for those who come after you. That can include tangible assets, but more importantly, the faith and values that have guided your life.
